### A message from the desk of Father Marreddy

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent, March 23, 2025- (C)

# Readings: Exodus 3:1-8a,13-15; 1 Corinthians 10:1-6,1-12; Luke 13:1-9

Third Sunday of Lent invites us to examine our lives and change for the better through a process of repentance and the need for the transformation of heart. It is something that we constantly need to be reminded about. Repentance demands that we become honest to ourselves and recognize our unfruitfulness.

The parable of the fig tree is a parable of crisis and compassion: the fig tree draws strength and sustenance from the soil but produces nothing in return. Its only value is as firewood. A similar fate awaits those who squander their lives in greedy, selfish pursuits. God is the ever-patient gardener who gives every "fig tree" all the time, care and attention it needs to harvest.

The parable of the fig tree has been called the "Gospel of the second chance." The vinedresser pleads for the tree, asking that it be given another year to bear fruit. We always live in the hope and mercy of God who keeps giving us "second chances" to rise from the ashes of sin to rebuild and reform our lives.

Jesus' parable of the barren fig trees illustrates His warning about the consequences of allowing sin and corruption to take root in our hearts and minds. Fig trees were a common and important source of food for the people of Palestine. A fig tree normally matured within three years, producing plentiful fruit. If it failed, it was cut down to make room for more healthy trees. A decaying fig tree and its bad fruit came to symbolize for the Jews the consequence of spiritual corruption caused by evil deeds and unrepentant sin.

The unfruitful fig tree symbolized the outcome of Israel's indifference and lack of response to God's word of repentance and restoration. The prophets depicted the desolation and calamity of Israel's fall and ruin due to her unfaithfulness to God as a languishing fig tree (read Joel 1:7,12; Habakkuk 3:17; and Jeremiah 8:13). Jesus' parable depicts the patience of God, but it also contains a warning that we should not presume upon God's patience and mercy. God's judgment will come in due course very soon or later.

The real danger and calamity which Jesus points out is that an unexpected disaster or a sudden death does not give us time to repent of our sins and to prepare ourselves to meet the Judge of heaven and earth. Jesus asks us to take responsibility for our actions and moral choices and put sin to death today before it can destroy our hearts, minds, souls, and bodies as well. Unrepentant sin is like a cancer which corrupts us from within. If it is not eliminated through repentance asking God for His forgiveness and healing grace, it leads to a spiritual death which is far worse than physical destruction.


