8th Sunday in Ordinary Time, March 2, 2025 (C) and *Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025* Readings: Sirach 27:4-7; 1 Corinthians 15:54-58; Luke 6:39-45

Are we clear-sighted, especially in our perception of sin and the need for each of one of us to see ourselves correctly as God sees us - with our faults, weaknesses, and strengths? Jesus' two parables about poor vision allude to the proverb: *Without vision the people perish!* (Proverbs 29:18) What can we learn from the illustration of a blind guide and a bad eye (the *log* in the eye)? A *bad eye* left untreated and a *blind guide* can cause a lot of trouble that will only end in misery and disaster for us! We are all in need of a physician who can help us overcome the blind spots and failing of own sins, weaknesses, and ignorance.

Do we know what we're doing for Lent in making this Lenten season more fruitful and meaningful? What is it that we want to give up as we contemplate and meditate the Suffering, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ? Is it a meal, a chocolate, meat, wine, etc., a day in a week or daily during Lent? Do we want to add daily Mass & Prayer & Stations of the Cross during Lent for our spiritual nourishment? Think about it seriously and make an effort to know God's plan for us.

Whining, complaining or even bragging about the changes we're making isn't what Lent is about. This is a time for us to reassess our lives so that we may become closer to Christ while contemplating the great sacrifice of His Passion.

Ash Wednesday-March 5, 2025

Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday. It is one of the most popular and important Holy Days in the liturgical calendar.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday through which we attain redemption.

Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. *Ashes in this case also symbolize grief, a grief that we have sinned and caused division from God.*

As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return", or "Repent and believe in the Gospel".
