## A message from the desk of Father Marreddy

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2025-C Cycle Readings: Isaiah 62:1-5; 1 Corinthians 12:4-11; John 2:1-11

At a wedding feast in Cana, Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water . . . Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." John 2: 1-11

This is the' first great "sign" of Jesus: the transformation of water into wine at the wedding feast at Cana. *Cana evokes two important Scriptural symbols that point to the Messiahship of Jesus:* 

**First,** wine in abundance was considered a sign for Israel of the Messianic age to come (one example is Isaiah 54: 5-14, Reading 4 for the Easter Vigil). The water in the six large stone jars used for the ritual washings mandated by the first covenant law is transformed by Jesus into Messianic wine, prefiguring the new covenant to be sealed in Jesus' blood (which we celebrate in the wine of the Eucharist).

**Second**, the limitless love of God for His people is described throughout Scripture in terms of marriage. Today's first reading from Isaiah is a beautiful example of this tradition. It is the strongest (yet still far from perfect) image we have to understand the depth of God's love for His holy people.

The Lord Jesus brought great blessing and joy to a newlywed couple and their wedding party. First by His presence, and second by saving them from embarrassment when the wine ran out. Changing water into wine was a remarkable act of kindness. In the Old Testament, wine is seen as both a gift and blessing of God (Deuteronomy 7:13; Proverbs 3:10, Psalm 105). That Jesus would miraculously produce the best wine shows the superabundance of the blessings which He came to offer.

This miracle signifies the "new rich wine" of the Gospel and it points to the "wine of the new covenant" and the "bread of life" which Jesus provides for His disciples in the Lord's Supper or Eucharist. It also points to the Messianic banquet which Jesus will provide at the end of the age when He comes again in His glory. The miracles of Jesus demonstrate the power of God's love and mercy for His people. God's kindness knows no limits. And the ultimate expression of His love is revealed in the person of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

Do I thirst for God and for the abundant life and blessings He offers to me?
