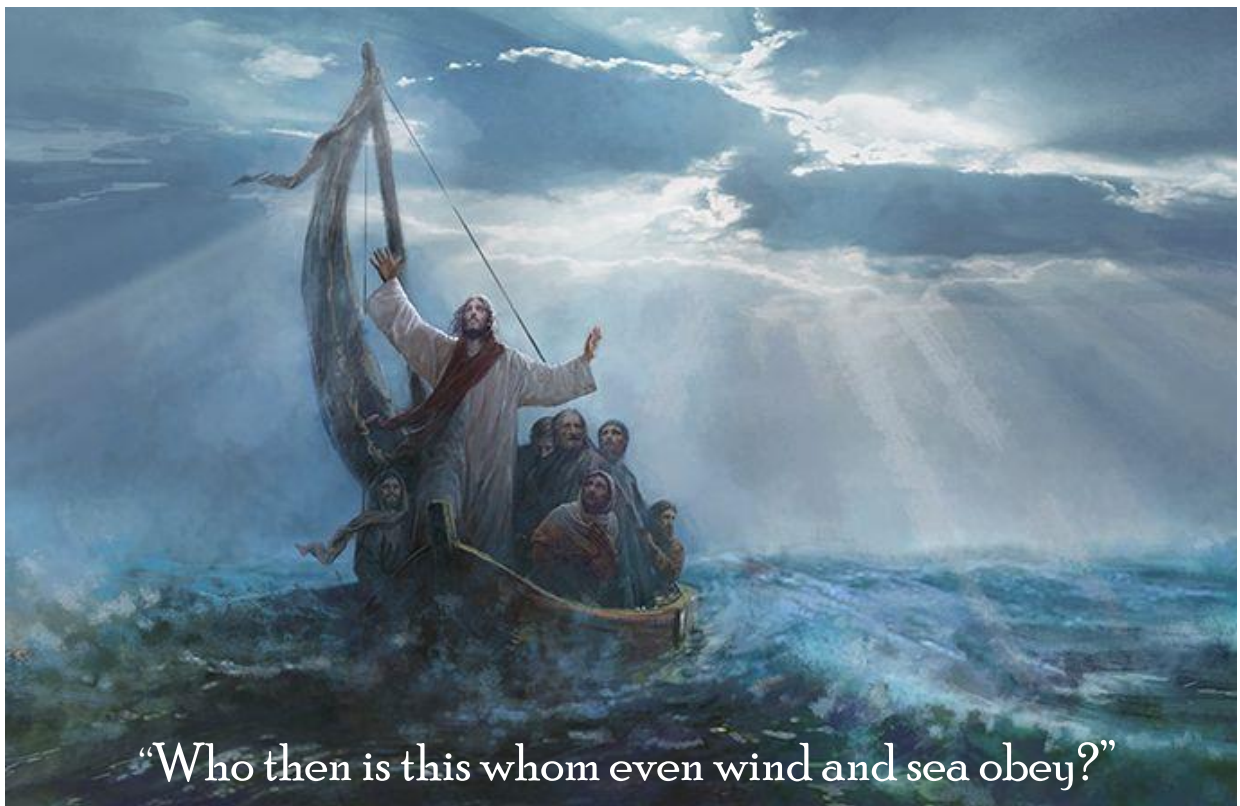

“Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?”

This weekend, June 22-23, Father Parrott will offer his last weekend Masses at St. Joseph and Christ the King Parishes. Everyone is invited to enjoy tacos in Christ the King Hall after the 5:30 p.m. Mass; everyone is invited to enjoy coffee and donuts after the 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. Masses in St. Joseph Hall. Please thank Father Parrott for his faithful priestly ministry at our parishes, and pray that the Lord will bless his new assignment as the Parochial Administrator of St. Ignatius Parish, Spring Valley; St. Finbarr Parish, Grand Meadow; and St. Patrick Parish, LeRoy. Next weekend, June 29-30, will be Father Parrott's last weekend at Sacred Heart Parish. Everyone is invited to join him for coffee and rolls after the 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. Masses.



Totus Tuus will be at our parishes **THIS WEEK June 23-28**; it is not too late to register! *Totus Tuus* (Latin for "Totally Yours") is the name of our Catholic Summer Faith Formation Program designed to help our children and grandchildren know, love, and serve God. *Totus Tuus* will hopefully set our young people "on fire" for the Faith, and inspire them to give themselves "totally" to Christ. The teachers for *Totus Tuus* are a team of two college-aged women and two college-age men who go from parish to parish in the diocese all summer, providing school-age children with this outstanding one-week program. Everyone is invited to join us for the special Mass offered each day at Sacred Heart Parish at 11:15 a.m. for the *Totus Tuus* participants (except for Tuesday, June 25, and Friday, June 28).

The Committee for Religious Liberty of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has designated June 22-29 as **Religious Freedom Week**. Beginning on June 22, the Memorial of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, and concluding on June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, *Religious Freedom Week* provides us with an opportunity to promote and defend our religious liberty in the United States of America. Our Lord says that some demons can only be driven out by "*prayer and fasting*." (Matthew 17:21) *Religious Freedom Week* is a beautiful time to combine prayer with fasting for the protection of our religious freedom. St. Anselm (+1109) wrote, "*In this world, God loves nothing more than the liberty of His Church.*" (*Magnificat*, April 2015)

Tomorrow, Monday, June 24, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist**. According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, the birthday of St. John the Baptist is celebrated because "John surpasses all the prophets, of whom he is the last." (CCC #523) The Solemnity of the Birth of St. John the Baptist is always celebrated on June 24 – six months before the birth of Christ – in accord with Luke 1:36. In referring to his cousin, Jesus Christ, St. John the Baptist said, "*He must increase while I must decrease.*" (John 3: 30) St. Augustine found this date (near the summer solstice) appropriate because, after the birth of St. John the Baptist, daylight hours are gradually decreasing, whereas after Jesus' birth (near the winter solstice) daylight hours are gradually increasing. Let us pray that in our own spiritual lives Jesus' importance is always increasing, and that "in the opinion of the world, I may decrease." (*Litany of Humility*)

Beginning this week on **Friday, June 28**, the Friday morning Mass at Christ the King Parish in Medford will begin at a new time, 8:00 a.m. After consulting with our new pastor, Father Marreddy, beginning Mass every day at 8:00 a.m. will allow for a consistent Mass time: Mass will be offered at 8:00 a.m. at either St. Joseph or Christ the King Parish every day of the week (except for Mondays). Thank you for your patience as we begin Mass one hour earlier at Christ the King in Medford.

At the direction of our new pastor, Father Marreddy, the **prayers recited after weekday Mass** at St. Joseph and Christ the King Parishes will be prayed before Mass at the conclusion of the rosary, **beginning the week of June 24**. The Prayer to St. Michael and the *Memorare* are already prayed at the end of the rosary; the Prayer to St. Joseph and the Vocation Prayer can be conveniently added to the end of the rosary prayers. Of course, the pious custom of kneeling down after Mass and saying private prayers silently is still strongly encouraged.

Saturday, June 29, is the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul**. The Apostles Peter and Paul are the co-founders of the Church of Rome, and they made Rome holy by shedding their blood out of love for Christ. This solemnity gives us the opportunity to renew our oath of fidelity to the Roman Pontiff, and to "all and everything" that the Roman Church "believes, teaches, and proclaims to be revealed by God."

Next weekend, June 29-30, we will take up a second collection for **Peter's Pence**. Your contributions to Peter's Pence go directly to Pope Francis, and enable the Holy Father to operate the Roman Curia. In addition, a small amount of your donation allows him to respond with emergency assistance to the people in most need throughout the world: those who suffer as a result of war, oppression, and natural disasters. Please use the special envelope in your packet (or stapled to the bulletin) for this collection.

Sunday, June 30, 2024, marks the end of the **fiscal year** in our parishes in the Diocese of Winona-Rochester. **Thank you** for your many generous contributions, which are necessary to keep our parish running on a balanced budget. Because of your many sacrifices, we were able to finish the fiscal year in the black, with no outstanding bills.

June 23 - Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time:

In the Gospel today, Jesus calms the sea and then asks the disciples "Why are you lacking in faith." In our life's journey, we also must learn to believe in God's presence and to trust in his care.

During the months of March, April and May, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was able to continue show God's love and care to others by assisting 138 adults and 81 children, providing \$345 in food, \$7816 for utility assistance, \$1285 for gas, \$8464 toward rent bills, \$164 for transportation, \$100 for Salvation Army vouchers, \$260 in furniture assistance and \$1520 for car repairs. On Tuesday evening Vincent's Table served 127 meals to those looking for a hot meal and fellowship.
