A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew **Glory to you, O Lord.**

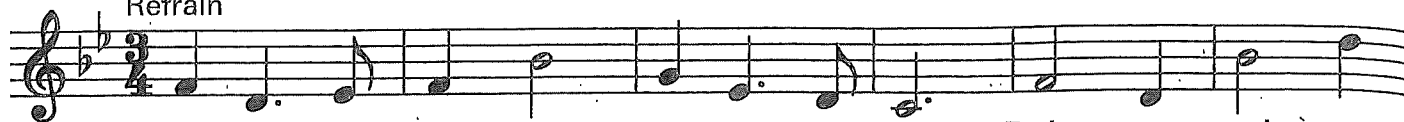
